

# General Information for the Class of 2024

## Prom

This year's prom will be on Saturday, April 13, 2024, at Valley Mansion, Timonium. The hours of the prom are 7:00pm -11:00pm. No one will be admitted after 8:00pm. All guests who attend the dance must have photo ID.

Tickets will be on sale March 1-15, 2024, via the School Cash Online website. All student obligations must be fulfilled before ticket approval. Tickets are \$85.00 each and **NO tickets will be sold at the door.** Prom **guest pass applications are attached to this packet or may** be obtained in the Main Office. Guest Passes are due back by **March 1<sup>st</sup>** to Mr. Quigg – NO EXCEPTIONS. A ticket for the guest may not be purchased until approved by Mr. Quigg.

You must attend school Friday (April 12) before the prom in order to attend prom.

All HCPS and school policies apply at prom. All persons in attendance must remain at the venue for the duration of the dance. Please be mindful of the dress code for formal wear. Young men should be in tuxedos or suits. Young ladies should be in modest formal wear. Jeans or tennis shoes are not permitted.

## Graduation

**Commencement Ceremony** to be held on Tuesday, May 28, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. at APGFCU Arena at Harford Community College, 401 Thomas Run Road, Bel Air, Maryland 21015

- **Doors open at 5:00 p.m.**
- Graduate attendance at commencement is required unless arrangements have been made with Mr. Quigg.
- **Cap, gown, and appropriate attire are required.**
- **Seniors must report to HCC Auxiliary Gymnasium by 5:15 p.m.**
- Each senior will receive **6 tickets** to graduation.
- *All guests, including infants, toddlers, and children, must have a ticket.*
- Wheelchair/Special Needs seating is available upon advanced request.
- **All graduates will be professionally photographed as they receive their diplomas and as they turn their tassels.** Before graduation, the seniors will be given a Lifetouch website address and a password to access all the images that will be posted online from graduation. Ordering will be done online.
- Graduation is a formal and dignified event and not one to be taken lightly. It is a very special day in the lives of these young adults. We have taken great efforts to make this a day they will remember. **We are asking all our guests to respect this event by dressing in appropriate attire and to refrain from calling out or rushing up to the graduates as they march by or walk across the stage.**

### Expectations for the Graduation Ceremony:

**Guests are not permitted to leave their seats for picture taking.** A professional photographer will be in attendance. The pictures will be taken of your graduate receiving his/her diploma and can be purchased at an affordable price.

- Out of respect for our students, please hold applause until each row is recognized.
- Please supervise younger siblings to maintain respect for the ceremony.
- Please refrain from taking family or group pictures while the students are proceeding out of the arena.
- Guests are not permitted to stand near the exits at the arena.
- Guests are not permitted to stand on or around the concourse.
- All guests must remain seated at all times.
- Strollers, bags and large purses are not permitted inside the arena. All items are to be locked in cars.
- Balloons and flowers are not permitted.
- Food and drink are not permitted in the arena. Some concessions may be available on site.
- Smoking/vaping is not permitted anywhere on the Harford Community College campus.

## CHECKLIST FOR CANDIDATES FOR GRADUATION

### 1. **ALL APPAREL MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH CURRENT DRESS CODE STANDARDS FOR Senior Awards and Graduation.**

Appropriate Attire is an important aspect of ceremonies at which Caps, and Gowns are worn. Harford County Public Schools dress code and the following requirements apply:

#### **Senior Awards & Graduation Attire:**

- Dress or skirt/dress pants/blouse combination in a style appropriate for a formal ceremony
  - Dress slacks (NO BLUE JEANS)
  - White or light-colored dress shirt with collar
  - Dark tie
  - Dark socks
  - Natural colored nylons or pantyhose (or none)
  - Dress shoes-(if choosing to wear heels, make sure they are of a size you can maneuver in) **flip flops, tennis shoes, boots or non-wedge heels are not permitted.**
  - Cap is worn flat, with tassel hanging to the right (No decorations on cap or gown)
  - Bring some bobby pins (about 6) to keep your cap on
  - Gown must be zipped.
  - **Handbags, backpacks, string bags are not permitted to be carried or worn with cap and gown attire.**
2. Do not leave your cap, gown, and tassel unattended; they are easily lost and difficult to replace.
  3. Candidates must be prompt, and in attendance **for each practice.** **There will be no exceptions. Requests for an absence from rehearsal/school must be submitted in writing in advance to Mr. Quigg. Approval of an absence from practice/school will only be granted by Mr. Quigg.** All emergencies must be communicated to Mrs. Lawrence.
  4. ***\*\*Attention Part Time Students: Graduation practice and Graduation are required. You must contact your employers now to either take off those days or change your schedule.***
  5. Candidates are reminded that acceptable behavior is a requirement for graduation practice. Inappropriate behavior may result in a student not being allowed to participate in graduation exercises. All policies of the Board of Education of Harford County are in effect at the above referenced events.
  6. Candidates are to stay off all Harford County Public School properties when school is not in session for seniors. Any violation could result in a student not being allowed to participate in graduation exercises.
  7. Candidates for graduation will be informed by School Counselors if they fail to meet the requirements for graduation.
  8. Tickets will be required for all guests, including individuals in wheelchairs, infants, toddlers, and children.
  9. Candidates are expected to discuss acceptable behavior during the graduation ceremony with family members and guests. Encourage your guests not to talk or call out during the ceremony and to turn off all cell phones and electronic devices prior to entering the arena.

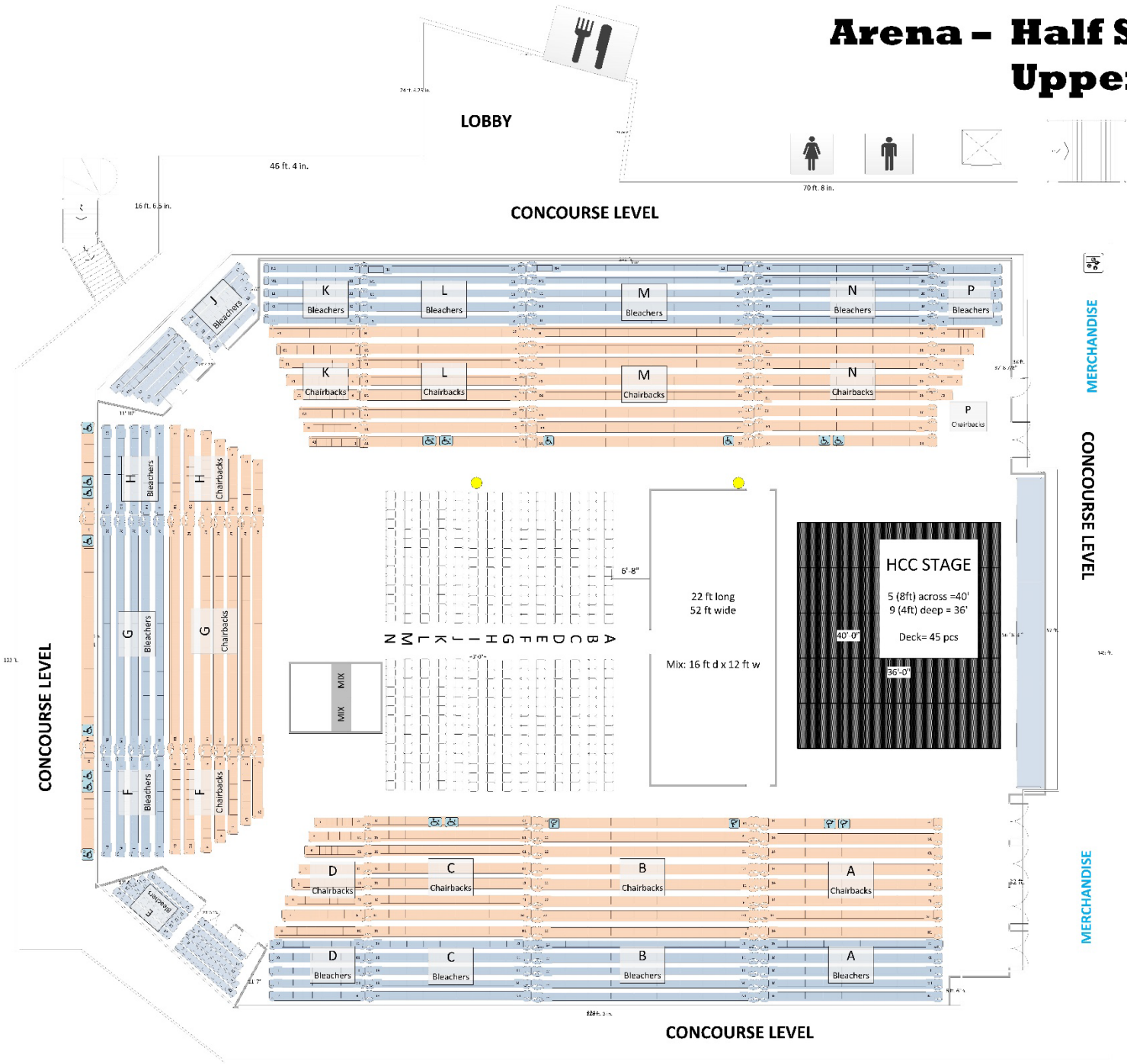

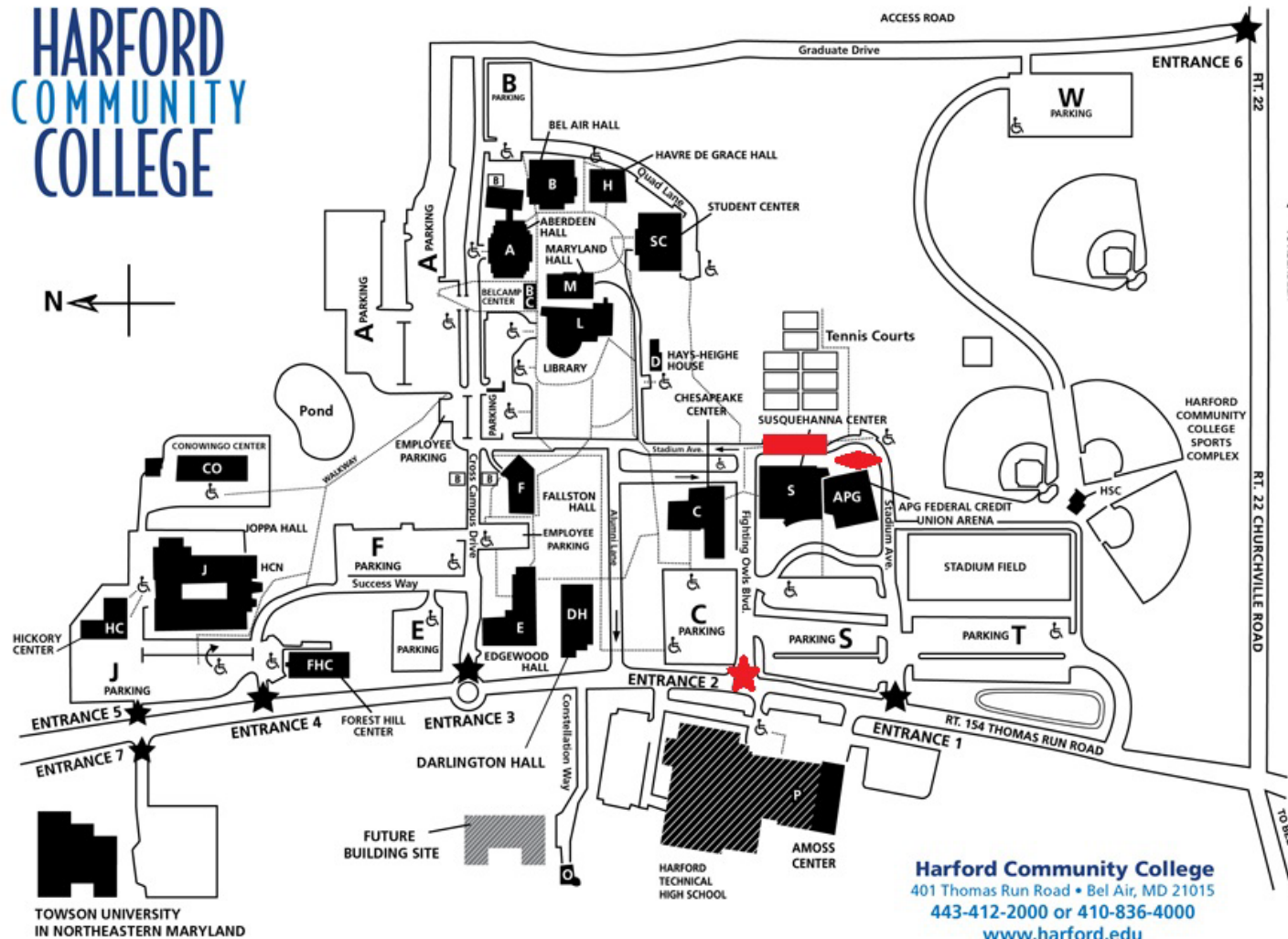
