Conditions to obtain Parking Privileges:

- Parking on school property is a privilege afforded to students.
- Only students with a valid driver's license and registration may apply for a permit.
- Maryland Law allows for vehicles parked on school property to be searched in accordance with applicable search and seizure laws and regulations. (Legal Reference: Education Article 7-308, Annotated code of Maryland COMAR 13A.08.01.14).
- Harford County Public Schools & Aberdeen High School assumes no liability for any damages to vehicles or their contents parked on school property. Any incident should be reported to police and school administration in writing.
- Any student who needs to drive to school and park on school grounds during school hours 7:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. must obtain a permit from the office.
- Parking permits are not transferable. Only the person whom the permit has been issued can use the permit.
- Demand far exceeds the space available, therefore permits will be issued on a prioritized basis as listed:
 - Handicapped
 - Boundary Exceptions
 - Dual Enrollment / Part- Time students
 - Community service
 - School sponsored sports and activities. (Seniors followed by Juniors, etc.)

Types of Permits:

- Full Year Permits will be issued to students for a non-refundable fee of \$25.00 who participate in:
 - Boundary Exceptions
 - Dual Enrollment / Part-Time student
 - Community service
 - School sponsored sports and activities. (Seniors followed by Juniors, etc.)

Conditions NOT Eligible for Permits:

- Students with outstanding financial obligations to the school.
- After school job related activities.
- After school appointments.

Students who meet the above conditions need to arrange work/appointment schedules to permit them to ride a bus to and from school or make alternate drop-off/pick-up arrangements.

Exceptions of Permit Holder:

 All vehicles parked on AHS campus during school hours must be registered with the main office.

- All issued permit hangtags must be displayed on the inside rearview mirror of the vehicle such that the permit is visible from outside the front windshield for inspection.
- Student Parking is only permitted in the main parking lot in front of the school facility. The Bus lot is reserved for bus parking only.
- Student are to park their vehicles as soon as they arrive on school property.
- Students may not loiter or sit in or around their vehicles on the parking lots once they arrive at school but must proceed into the building.
- Students are not to return to the parking lot or their vehicles during the school day without permission and possible escort by and administrator.
- Students are prohibited from leaving school property during the day after the vehicle has been parked, without the appropriate release pass.
- The driver of the vehicle is responsible for the behavior and actions of all passengers in the vehicle.
- All Harford county Public School rules are to be followed while students are in cars on school property, including tobacco possession and smoking.
- Lost or stolen permits will not be replaced.
- Driving speed on campus is a maximum of 10 MPH.
- Parking is a PRIVELEGE and can be removed as part of disciplinary actions taken by administration.

Dual Enrollment and Part Time Students:

- Must leave school property promptly at the appropriate time.
- Must take the most direct route off campus.
- Not authorized to take other students from school property without appropriate documentation cleared through the school administration.
- Not authorized to ride through other areas or deliver another student to a vehicle.

Conditions of Revocation:

- Driving recklessly or at speeds more than 10 MPH will result in loss of permit.
- Inappropriate behavior of driver or passengers may be sufficient cause to revoke parking privileges.
- Sharing a permit will result in immediate and permanent loss of permit.
- Violations of above stated expectations might result in loss of permit.
- Poor attendance truancy, class cutting, ineligibility, citizenship infractions, or any other action determined by the administration may result in loss of permit.
